This report sets out details of the academy's Sport Premium allocation and the impact it is having/will have on pupils' educational attainment.

£9,910 of Sport Premium funding will be allocated in 2014-15. Split into two payments over the academic year:

£5,781 in October 2014

£4,129 in April 2015

Updated Resources

Generic new equipment for P.E. sessions – £1,590.93

A variety of new equipment, including balls, hoops and beanbags.

The children are able to apply their learning using the correct, functional equipment.

Specific new equipment for cheerleading P.E. sessions – £184.20

Two cheerleading packs for P.E. Dance sessions. The packs include pom-poms, flags and ribbons.

The children are able to take part in Dance sessions that they are interested in, which leads to more engaged learning.

Specific new equipment for Box 2B Fit After-School Club – £456.00

A specialist boxing kit for children's circuit training. Includes boxing gloves and pads, skipping ropes, medicine balls, the scheme of work and a CD.

The children invited along to the Box 2B Fit after-school club gain a higher understanding of the importance of fitness, and become more fit themselves.

New football strips for school football team – £175.00

A set of 15 football kits (tops, shorts and socks) in a range of sizes for the school football team to wear when playing matches and tournaments with other schools.

The children feel part of an organised team which leads to more confident play. They represent the school in the school colours.

Specialist Coaching

Manchester Football Club United-Football – £96.00 ongoing

Specialist Football coach leading a Football after school club.

The children receive specialist, specific coaching in a sport they thrive in. They apply the skills and knowledge they learn with the coach to Football tournaments and matches with other schools.

Specialist Cricket coach leading a Cricket after-school club.

Specialist Training

Level 5 Professional Qualification in Primary School Physical Education Specialism –

£500

Head of P.E. attending five sessions over the school year, along with assignments to complete, in order to gain a more in depth understanding of teaching P.E. in Primary Schools.

The P.E. sessions the children receive will be based on sound, up-to-date knowledge, which leads to greater Physical Literacy in the school as a whole. The head of P.E. will create a network of P.E. colleagues which will lead to more 'friendly' matches and, in turn, boost Cravenwood Academy's profile in the area.
